Delete rule II. It is not practical to have a Novice Team that has at least four members who are freshmen or young to commit to finding three more members to Compete in the National Conduct of Chapter meetings so that they can be announced at the time the winning team is announced. For example, in 2023, the winning Novice team has four freshmen members. Following the announcement of the winners at Fresno, the coach was informed they were eligible to compete if they could find two people to replace their two sophomores and find one more. A couple of day later they decided there were not interested. The advisor of the second placed team was invited to compete. That team had 8th and 9th grade students. They would have needed to find one more member to attend. They chose not to compete.

Rule IV. Delete the last sentence.

Rule V, change to the following. "Each section will determine how many chapter teams may participate at the section level. Each region will determine how many sectional teams may compete at the region level. Participation at the state level is limited to a maximum of four (4) teams per region.

Presentation Rule A. Change to the following. "Teams will be seeded in the round based on test scores."

Presentation Rule B. Delete 3"x5" and replace with "Index Card".

Presentation Rule C. Delete 3"x5" and replace with "Index Card".

Presentation Rule L. Change the first time listed in the table to be 11:00.

Page 7, Event Scoring, change the last sentence to 11:00.

Page 8, the Chart of Permissible Motions, add "Point of Information" to the list.

Page 9, Form 2, Time Deduction from 10 minutes, 30 seconds to 11 minutes.

A. A written test will consist of 25 objective-type multiple-choice questions covering basic parliamentary law as related to the permissible motions of the event and pertaining to minutes. Questions will (should be developed using Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised and take) come from Dunbar's Manual of Parliamentary Procedure Test Questions.

II. Oral Questions

A. Each of the six team members will be asked a planned question relating to their assigned motion. Following these six questions, the judges will have two additional minutes to ask questions for clarification of the presentation, after which time will be called.

K. Time Limit and Deductions - A team shall be allowed 11 minutes in which to demonstrate knowledge of parliamentary law. A timer will be displayed so that each member can see. If a timer is not available a 8 minute and 10 minute warning sign will be shown to the team. A deduction of two points/second for every second over 11 minutes will be assessed. Example: 11:05 = 10-point deduction. A timekeeper will furnish the time used by each team at the close of the event.

Issue: (Describe the reason/rationale for the proposed change.)

Change #1: This change is specific to the novice portion of the parliamentary procedure and debate contest. I propose to limit the number of debatable subsidiary motions on the card to TWO. In the advanced contest, the code requires that the motion cards do not assign more than two subsidiary, two incidental, and one privileged motion. I propose to align the novice contest in a similar format. Other subsidiary motions can be on the card, but we can have no more than 2 required debatable motions.

The reason behind the change is the illogical nature of having more than two on the card. To refer, postpone to a certain time, amend, AND postpone indefinitely a main motion is pretty rare to happen in a legitimate chapter meeting. Second, it is extremely challenging for novice students to properly lay out a demonstration with 3 to 4 debatables on the motion card. Oftentimes it causes teams to go over the allotted time for a demonstration, causes confusion within the team, and does not make logical sense in a round.

Change #2: This change is also specific to the novice portion of the contest. The change would be regarding 7th/8th graders competing in novice. I would like to propose that if 8th graders compete at the state level in the novice contest, they forfeit their eligibility to compete in novice their freshman year. They are still able to compete at every other contest. The reason behind this is to "even the playing field" with freshmen not being able to compete as a sophomore; additionally, it will remain a true "novice" contest... only first year members competing. As the rules currently state, a student can compete up to 3 years at the novice level if they start 7th grade year, and this provides an unfair advantage to those schools that have a middle school program. Many schools in California do not have the advantage of a feeder school with an agriculture program to start parli pro at a younger age.

Change #2: Amend Rules Section I: Seventh and 8th grade members are eligible to compete in the novice contest. If a seventh or eighth grader competes at the state finals contest, they forfeit their eligibility to compete the subsequent year on a novice team. Ninth or 10th grade members are also eligible to compete in the novice contest, but are restricted to competing one year in either 9th or 10th grade.
